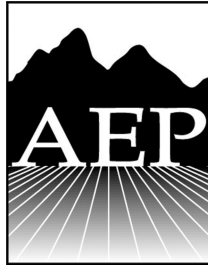

2010 STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The San Diego Chapter of AEP supports students who are actively engaged in the pursuit of a career in a field with an environmental emphasis. As part of our support efforts, we are offering scholarships to undergraduate or graduate students attending any of the major universities in San Diego County. The monetary award will be up to \$2,000 per scholarship recipient. In addition, the scholarship recipient(s) will also receive a complimentary one-year student membership to AEP, which includes all the benefits of professional membership, including the monthly professional newsletter, notification of networking events, reduced rates for Chapter luncheons, and reduced rates for the State Annual Conference and bi-annual CEQA workshops. The scholarship(s) will be awarded at the San Diego Chapter Annual Awards and Scholarship Benefit held in Fall 2010 (September/October). The scholarship recipient(s) are expected to attend this event.

Who Can Apply?

The San Diego Chapter of AEP will accept applications from undergraduates or graduate students who are actively engaged in the pursuit of a career in a field with an environmental emphasis. In addition, copies of current college transcripts, a maximum two-page essay, and letter(s) of recommendation from persons not related to you, but who are familiar with your abilities and interests, are required. Undergraduate students are required to provide one recommendation letter and graduate students are required to provide two recommendation letters. Applicants must also have a minimum 3.0 GPA.

How Can The Money Be Used?

The award can be used for any aspect of education. This includes tuition, books, housing, research, etc. The recipient(s) will receive a check in their name from the San Diego Chapter of AEP.

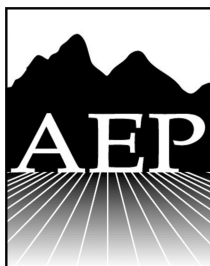

Please include the following information with the application:

- A copy of the most recent transcript from your current university.
- An essay of no greater than two pages on 8½" x 11" paper. Essay shall be single-spaced with no smaller than 10-point font and 1-inch margins on all sides. Your essay must address all of the following topics:
 - Describe a personal experience that has influenced your decision to go into an environmental field.
 - Describe your background relating to environmental issues, including education, training, internships and work experience.
 - Discuss the environmental issues that are most important or of greatest interest to you. Please explain why.
- Letter(s) of recommendation from individuals (not related to you) who are familiar with your abilities and interests. One letter of recommendation is required for undergraduates and two letters of recommendation are required for graduate students.
